

# Some Guidelines for ATT Users

- The ATT is a multi-use trail and was designed to accommodate walkers, hikers, cyclists, roller-bladers and equestrians and those using wheel chairs.
- Except when passing others, **trail users should keep to the right. On the Durham section and the asphalt section in Chatham County please observe the yellow center lines. On the soft surface sections in Chatham and Wake, please try to use only the right hand half of the trail. Cyclists should shift to single file when overtaking or meeting other users.**
- Equestrian use is permitted in Durham County south of Scott-King Rd. and on all portions of the trail in Chatham and Wake Counties.
- Bicycles and others on wheels should slow down when approaching or passing runners/walkers or horses.
- When overtaking a horse, cyclist or hiker from behind, give audible warning of your approach. Ex. **“Passing on your left”**
